

## **BBB's Consumer Checklist: BBB.** Tips for Hiring a Contractor

Check the Track Record Gather information on potential contractors. Search for a contractor's Business Profile on BBB.org or call BBB's Help Line at 614-486-6336.	Confirm Permits  Permits ensure the work meets building codes and safety regulations and should be obtained before any project begins.
Get Multiple Quotes Getting 3+ written estimate bids allows comparison of warranty, specifications, labor, time, and profit and overhead.  Ask for References Ask at least 3 recent, local references about services performed, overall experience, budget adherence, and work quality.	Get it in Writing  Don't let work begin without a written and co-signed contract. Ensure:  • Specific Correct Start/ Completion Dates • Contact Information • Extra Costs & Material Costs, Detailed/Exact Work Scope • Payment Arrangements • Warranty Information
Verify Employees Ask if employees and subcontractors are background checked, trained, and certified. Ask what ID to expect upon arrival. Cross-check anyone proposed to be in your home for criminal history.	Arrange a Payment Schedule Never pay large payments up front or pay final payments until the job's completed. Stagger payments and NEVER PAY CASH - using a credit card may offer future recourse.
Verify License and Insurance Ensure if the contractor has a valid Home Improvement Contractor (HIC) license and is appropriately bonded.	Get a Receipt  Request a receipt marked "Paid in Full" upon job completion/final payment. Keep copies.
Ask For Lien Waivers Ask for a lien waiver to protect from lien placement against your home/	Keep your Contract File contracts for future reference if any questions arise after work is complete.
