Submit Your Application

What is the BBB Students of Integrity Award?

An award program for high school seniors who personify high character through leadership, personal integrity, and academic excellence.

Who is eligible to enter?

Each high school within BBB's 21-county service area may nominate one student from the 2024-2025 **junior** class with at least a 3.5 GPA. The awards will be presented in fall 2025, when the students are seniors.

When is the deadline for applications?

Deadline for submission is **May 5, 2025**. If submitting online please go to **BBBStudentsofIntegrity.com**. If entries are submitted via postal mail, they must be postmarked by May 5, 2025.

What will the recipients receive?

Ten students will receive a scholarship of \$1,000 each, to be presented at a special ceremony in the fall of 2025.

Entry and judging criteria:

The contest is open to current **high school juniors**, who will be entering their senior year of high school in fall 2025. Entries will be reviewed by a panel of judges comprised of business leaders and members of the academic community. Judges will select recipients based on demonstrated qualities of leadership and personal integrity, contributions to community and school, and a written essay.

Judges will score as follows: essay (35%), community service (30%), leadership (30%), and academics (5%). Guidance counselors must provide a letter verifying the student has at least a 3.5 GPA.

Each applicant should submit an Entry Portfolio that includes the following documentation of their commitment to ethical behavior. Entries can be submitted electronically or in hardcopy format. If submitting a hardcopy entry, the application should be typed on 8.5 x 11" paper, one-sided, with at least an 11 pt. font and 1" margins. The first page of the portfolio should be the completed entry form.

Section 1 - Leadership (30%)

- Describe activities inside and outside of school in which you've had a leadership role. You may include sports, student clubs or organizations, church or special community activities. Include awards/honors, offices held and length of time participated. Please use a resume format.
- Write a paragraph to reflect on what you learned as a leader as a result of your experiences.

Section 2 - Community Service/Work Experience (30%)

- Describe community service you have participated in (inside or outside of school). Include awards/honors or offices held and length of time participated. Please use a resume format.
- List any paid work experience with dates of employment and job description. Please use a resume format.
- Write a paragraph to reflect on how these experiences impacted your attitude and behavior.

Section 3 - Academics (5%)

- Describe awards received for your academic achievement. Please use a resume format.
- In a paragraph, describe your post-secondary education plans and career goals.

Section 4 - Essay (35%)

- Please read the UncommonSense Framework (p.4), then select one of the 20 principles and share a personal experience to explain why you have chosen it and how it is applied in your life. The essay should be a minimum of 500 words and a maximum of 750. Please include *UncommonSense* principle in the title of your essay.

Letters of Recommendation

- A letter of recommendation from a school official, church leader, employer or community leader that addresses the applicant's character.
- A letter from the school guidance counselor verifying that the applicant's GPA is 3.5 or above. (Transcripts are not necessary)

Use the checklist below and be sure to proof read your submission.

- ☐ Sections 1-3 (left) leadership, service/work experience and academic resumes with reflection paragraphs.

I will strive to forgive others, even when undeserved, and ask humbly for others to forgive me.

8. Unity

I will strive to build relationships that foster harmony and collaboration.

9. Learning & Mentoring

I will strive to grow in wisdom and pass it on.

10. Serving-Leadership

I will strive to put the success of others and the group ahead of my own.

11. Honoring Authority

I will strive to respect boundaries and honor those given responsibility for others.

12. Justice

I will strive to uphold the truth, expose error and correct wrongs.

13. Courage

I will strive to act on my principles, and persevere through difficulties.

14. Accountability

I will strive to self-evaluate and welcome feedback from others.

15. Stewardship

I will strive to act responsibly toward the world and all resources.

16. Seek Counsel

I will seek advice from others who have wisdom, especially when confronted with ethically ambiguous situations.

17. Responsibility

I will strive to fulfill my obligations as a family member and citizen.

18. Excellence

I will strive to be my very best as I do my very best everyday.

19. Maturation

I will strive to learn from experience and improve over time.

20. Transformation

I will strive to be committed to consistent, positive character.
