Protect Yourself from Scams

Reach out to someone you trust. Scammers try to isolate their victims. Don't hesitate to contact a friend, loved one, or organization you trust for advice. A second opinion can greatly reduce your risk. Call your local Better Business Bureau® at 775-322-0657.

Always be cautious about urgent unsolicited messages, whether it's by phone, text, email, or another means of contact.

Resist the urge to act immediately, no matter how dramatic the story is or how threatening or intimidating the caller sounds.

Guard your personal information (Social Security number, Medicare number, account numbers/passwords, etc.). Never share it with a stranger on the phone, in an email, or on social media.

Never send money (in any form) to someone you have never met face-to-face.

Use extreme caution when dealing with anyone you've met online.

Never allow remote access to your computer if somebody offers tech support.
